J. Fraser Mustard, following a career in academic, medical and health science at the University of Toronto and McMaster University, founded with a number of his colleagues, The Canadian Institute for Advanced Research [CIAR] in 1982. In developing CIAR, a major focus was on science, technology, innovation and economic growth and the effect of economic change on the social environment and the health and well being of individuals and populations.

Dr. Mustard is presently the Founding President and Institute Fellow of CIAR. He currently leads the Foundersa€™ Network of the CIAR, which are individuals who helped build CIAR.

Foundersa€™ Network has been working in collaboration with the governments in Canada and Australia, and the World Bank and the InterAmerican Development Bank in respect to the social determinants of health and human development in Latin America, East Africa and South Asia.

Dr. Mustard is on the board of the Aga Khan University in Karachi, Pakistan, Past Chairman of PENCE [Protein Engineering National Centre of Excellence]; Beatrice House [a residential program for homeless mothers with young children] and Past Chairman of Ballard Power Systems [Vancouver].
